Buckhorn Children & Family Services is seeking for energetic and enthusiastic individuals to work in the following positions/programs:

Residential Treatment Program – Dessie Scott Children’s Home Campus (Wolfe County)

Cook: Essential duties will include food area preparation and service area sanitation. Using standard recipes, prepares food for agency youth, employees, patrons and guests. Must be knowledgeable of kitchen equipment and can read a recipe and cook. Must have a high school diploma/GED.

Residential Youth Workers: Supervises and nurtures children (males ages 12-20 with autism spectrum disorder) in a beautiful campus atmosphere. The job responsibilities for a youth worker include teaches social and life skills, provides direct care services to youth, ensures all required reports and paperwork are completed accurately and are ready for review, engages youth in ongoing one on one interaction, and ensures the implementation of the youth’s treatment plan. Must have a high school diploma/GED.

Clinician/Therapist: Provides therapeutic intervention with developmentally delayed/intellectually disabled boys between the ages of 12 to 20 years old in a residential setting. Prepare treatment plans and serve on the treatment team. Perform assessments and provide individual/group/family therapy. Must have a master’s degree in the human services field with two or more years of experience working with children and families. Candidate must hold a valid Kentucky license (i.e., LPCC, LSCW, LMFT or LPP) or certification (i.e., LPCA, CSW with supervision, LPA-Psych. Assoc.) to provide therapy. Kentucky State Board approved supervision provided, as needed.

Family Preservation/Reunification Program – Somerset (Lake Cumberland Region) and Corbin (Cumberland Valley Region)

Family Preservation Specialist: This position requires an experienced professional that will manage an assigned number of clients (Children, adults and/or families). Provides therapeutic intervention with client families in their home or natural setting. Prepares treatment plans and serves on treatment team. Provides direct in-home services to support family stabilization or reunification. Assesses individual, family and community risks, family needs, and community resources. Provides case management to link families with appropriate resources. Must have a bachelor’s degree in human services field.

FPP Clinician/Therapist: Responsible for therapeutic environment/culture of the program, provide therapeutic interventions as needed and therapy with individuals and groups per Agency Policies and State/Federal Regulations. Prepare treatment plans and lead the treatment team meetings. Must have a master’s degree in the Human Services Field with three years of experience or two years of experience working with children and families and hold a license or certification to provide therapy.
